Notes: Cumberland heads to Oklahoma for six games in five days, starting Saturday at Oklahoma City University ... CU's last trip to the Sooner State came March 12-14, 2007. The Bulldogs lost at Southern Nazarene (11-7) and Oklahoma City (7-2) on March 12 and to the College of the Ozarks (8-6) on the 13th. Cumberland ended the trip with a doubleheader sweep of Oklahoma City, 5-3 and 6-2. No current CU players were on the roster for that season.

Bulldogs off to hot start

Cumberland is off to its best start in recent years, winning nine of its first 10 games, including victories over Division II North Alabama and perennial NAIA postseason qualifier Missouri Baptist. The Bulldogs are 7-1 at home in the early season and embark on their first major road test of the year with six games in five days in Oklahoma this week.

Greener off to fast start at the plate

Senior Matt Greener has been red-hot through Cumberland's first 10 games this season, batting .467 with three doubles, two home runs, 10 runs scored and 12 RBIs. The Jupiter, Fla., native has hit safely in all 10 contests, including four multi-hit games so far in 2010. Greener was named the TranSouth Player of the Week on February 22 after going 7-for-11 with four runs scored, three doubles, two home runs and 10 RBIs in CU's five games that week, including both homers and six RBIs in one contest, against the Univ. of St. Francis. The third baseman struggled at times last season, posting only four homers and 29 RBIs in 183 at-bats while starting at five different positions.

Hurlers have been exquisite

Cumberland's pitching staff has been nothing short of phenomenal through the first 10 games of the season, allowing just 22 runs, 14 earned, on 60 hits while posting a 1.70 team ERA. Opponents are batting just .221 against the Bulldogs, who have 67 strikeouts to just 15 walks in 74.0 innings of work. Starters and relievers have shared in the excellent work, with the starters

combining for an 8-1 record with a 1.77 ERA in 56.0 innings, striking out 52. Opponent are batting only .248. The relievers have been just as good if not better, posting a .150 ERA and three saves in 18.0 innings while opponents are batting a miniscule .148.

Fanshawe in the middle of everything

Junior David Fanshawe has made an immediate impact at Cumberland, taking over the catching duties from departed senior Kyle West and posting terrific offensive numbers as well. Fanshawe is batting .440 in eight games with two doubles, one home run and five RBIs along with six walks and just three strikeouts. He has seemed to be in the middle of every scoring rally in the early going as well, either by getting on base or driving in a key run. His opening performance, a 3-for-4 effort with a solo homer and two runs scored at Division II North Alabama, certainly made an impression. The Miami, Fla., native may have made an even bigger contribution behind the plate, where he has thrown out 4-of-10 would-be base stealers and already registered one pickoff. The Bulldog pitching staff currently owns a 1.70 team ERA and opponents are batting just .221, certainly a nod to Fanshawe's terrific skills behind the plate.

Schaefer very sharp in two starts

Senior Shawn Schaefer, the workhorse of last season's staff after tossing 88.0 innings in 11 starts, has picked up this season in even better form, giving up just three earned runs in two starts and posting the Bulldogs two best wins of the year, over Division II North Alabama and versus Missouri Baptist. The lefthander cruised through five innings at UNA in the season opener, retiring the side in order in three frames and facing just three batters over the minimum total. He allowed three hits in the sixth and left with the

lead, walking one and striking out three in the victory. He was even sharper in last Saturday's win over MBU, tossing a one-hit shutout with two walks and three strikeouts. He allowed just a one-out single in the first inning and walked one in both the fifth and sixth innings. Only one player reached third base in the contest. The Pitt Meadows, British Columbia, native is 2-0 with a 2.13 ERA in 12.2 innings of work with just six hits allowed and six strikeouts.

Kikla picks up where he left off

Senior Sam Kikla led the Bulldogs in nine offensive categories last season, including hits, runs, home runs, RBIs and stolen bases. The Malabar, Fla., native has picked up where he left off, batting .419 with 12 runs scored and seven RBIs through 10 games. Kikla has started three times at first

base and seven games at shortstop in 2010 after playing both second base and shortstop last season. He is currently on an eight-game hitting streak, including nine hits in 17 at-bats in his last five outings. One major improvement for the Seminole CC transfer has been a better eye at the plate. Kikla has drawn five walks already this season but more importantly has just three strikeouts after registering 37 in 2009.

Post, Sprague register strong performances

Seniors Robert Post and Adam Sprague have been a big part of the pitching staff's success so far in 2010, with both recording strong efforts in their two starts. Post tossed a three-hit shutout in his first appearance of the year, walking one and striking out six against the Univ. of St. Francis. He was not as sharp in last week's showing ver-

sus Viterbo Univ., giving up four unearned runs and seven hits in six innings, but the righthander still posted his second victory, running his career mark to 8-4. Sprague may have been more impressive against USF in his start, striking out a career-high 10 batters and allowing only three hits in six innings. He gave up eight hits but just one earned run in last week's outing versus Viterbo for his second win as well. Post and Sprague have combined to go 4-0 with a 0.36 ERA in 25.0 innings of work so far this season, with opponents batting just .231 and 23 strikeouts.

Frazier starting to find his stroke

University of Kentucky transfer Troy Frazier has begun to find his hitting stroke for the Bulldogs, earning TranSouth Conference Player of the Week honors this past Monday after knocking

in 11 runs in four games. Frazier went 9-for-14 (.643) with one double, two home runs and seven runs scored in the four contests. The Louisville, Ky., native collected seven hits and a pair of homers in Sunday's doubleheader sweep of Viterbo Univ., including a solo shot in the first game and a grand slam to end the second contest. Frazier has hit safely in six of his 10 outings this season after playing in only 25 games last season at UK. He also has 12 runs scored and seven walks with just four strikeouts.

Kern becomes the closer

Junior Daniel Kern was roughed up a bit in his first appearance of the season at North Alabama, giving up two runs on three hits in one inning, but the Pompano Beach, Fla., native has been perfect since, saving two games and working two hitless innings in the process. Kern allowed the two runs at UNA in the ninth inning of a 12-6 victory, but tossed a perfect inning with two strikeouts in a 7-4 triumph over Viterbo Univ. last Saturday and got the final three outs in a 5-3, 10-inning victory at St. Catharine College this past Tuesday. He walked one and struck out one at SCC, saving the victory in relief of Matt Vance.

Miller finding a home

In what is a very crowded outfield picture for the Bulldogs, junior Kris Miller has made a case to become the regular leftfielder alongside mainstays Troy Frazier in center and Max Kautz in right. Miller is only batting .267 overall but has collected six hits over the last four contests along with six RBIs and four doubles. He started the year with three RBIs in the season opener at North Alabama but then managed just one hit in the next five games. But he collected one hit in last Saturday's 7-4 victory over Viterbo Univ. and came back with three more hits against the V-Hawks the next day. He also managed two hits in Tuesday's extra inning affair at St. Catharine College.

Greener named Player of the Week

Senior Matt Greener was named the TranSouth Conference Player of the Week on February 22 by the league office after batting .636 in five games and helping the Bulldogs start the season by winning 4-of-5 outings. Greener went 7-for-11 in four starts with four runs scored, three doubles, two home runs and 10 RBIs. He also recorded a walk and stole a base. The Jupiter, Fla., native drove in a pair of runs in a 12-6 victory in CU's season opener at North Alabama. He doubled twice and drove in a run in the home opener against the Univ. of St. Francis and then registered six RBIs in the second game, hitting a solo homer and a grand slam in the same inning. Greener hit just four home runs and drove in 29 runs all of last season in 183 at-bats. He had at least one hit in all five games and at least one RBI in four of the five contests.

Schaefer named to All-Canadian Team

Cumberland's Shawn Schaefer was recently named to the CanadianBaseballNetwork.com All-Canadian College Team. The lefthander was an Honorable Mention selection and was the only player from the TranSouth Conference in the listings. Schaefer tossed 5.2 innings in CU's season-opening victory at North Alabama, allowing four runs on five hits with one walk and three strikeouts. Last season the Pitt Meadows, British Columbia, native was the anchor of the Bulldogs staff, working a team-high 88.0 innings and posting a 6-3 record with a 4.40 ERA. He struck out 69 in 13 appearances, registering seven complete games. Just two other players from the Mid-South Conference were on the list – Marc Wilson from Campbellsville Univ. Bulldogs ranked 19th nationally

Cumberland is ranked 19th nationally in the NAIA Baseball Coaches' Preseason Top 25 Poll announced in November. Cumberland finished the 2009 season 33-25 overall, advancing to the NAIA Regionals in Hattiesburg, Miss. The Bulldogs won the TranSouth regular season last year with a 15-5 mark and return only three position starters but six pitchers, including three of the top four hurlers, and welcome 36 newcomers to this year's club. Cumberland was the only TranSouth team ranked in the Top 25. Union Univ. received the other three first-place votes in the TranSouth poll. Union just missed a Top 25 ranking, garnering 94 total points to finish 27th.

Record number of games on radio

Woody Hunt

Head Coach • Belmont Univ./1980 • 29th Season • 1,235-515-3 (.705) overall



Cumberland University owes a great debt of gratitude to legendary and Hall of Fame head coach Woody Hunt for his great service not only to the baseball program but also to the athletic department and the University as well as the community of Lebanon.

Hunt begins his 28th season as head coach of the Bulldogs in 2009 and his 31st with the Cumberland program. He has amassed an impressive resume along the way and continues to add to his credentials with each passing year.

But even more importantly Hunt continues to play a major role within the overall landscape of the University as well as in the Lebanon and Wilson County communities where so many of his former players have settled into lives after baseball.

Hunt is one of only six coaches in history to register 1,000 career victories in the NAIA and heads into the '09 season with a 1,193-489-3 overall record. The Bulldogs have appeared in 10 NAIA World Series, including four in the last five seasons, but his most crowning program achievement came when CU claimed the 2004 national championship in Lewiston, Idaho. The Bulldogs have finished as the national runner-up on two other occasions, in 1995 and 2006.

Cumberland has won 16 conference championships during Hunt's tenure, including 10 in the Tennessee

Collegiate Athletic Conference (TCAC), five in the Mid-South Conference (MSC) and one in the TranSouth Conference (TSAC). CU has four district championships, 11 NAIA regional titles and has played in five super regionals as well.

The program has posted 20 seasons with 40 or more victories, including 16 of the last 17 years, while registering 50 or more wins seven times, all in the last dozen seasons. The 2004 squad set the school-record for victories with 59.

The Bulldogs have produced 51 NAIA All-Americans, including Steve Green, the only three-time All-American in program history. Seventy-two of Hunt's former players have signed professional contracts.

The Bulldogs have posted a 311-120 record over the last six seasons with five NAIA World Series appearances, one runner-up finish and one national title.

Hunt has also achieved individual success in the awards category, claiming 16 Coach of the Year honors, including the 2006 Rawlings National Coach of the Year award. He is a seven-time Southeast Region Coach of the Year and has also been a finalist for the National Coach of the Year Award four times.

Perhaps his greatest achievement lies in the facilities in which his team plays, practices and dresses. Cumberland has one of the finest baseball facilities in the nation, second to none in the NAIA, with Ernest L. Stockton Field and its 500 chairback seats and state-of-the-art press box, the Benton Jennings Indoor Hitting Complex and the Jeanette C. Rudy Clubhouse.
