A Tradition of Giving Continues at HIYC

When our Club was founded, the Charter Members realized the new organization's only hope for growth was to keep charges low and affordable for young couples. But this meant there often was not enough money to do what needed to be done.

For example: In the early days (before "city water") the members wanted to trade privies for real "flush toilets." Through cash gifts from members, a water filtration plant using lake water was purchased and installed in rear of the old club house; and through a major gift from present member Billy Sumner, a system was invented and installed to pump the effluent toward the top of the hill. Later, the dinghy fleet needed a parking lot boat hoist that the Club could not afford. So, again, individual members made gifts that paid for the hoist which we are using today. More recently, the Club needed a fleet of Optimist Prams for training children to sail. So generous members gave thousands of dollars to purchase the present Opti Fleet which has benefitted so many of our children and grandchildren. Many members have given boats to our Club; and Ross Bryan gave his Swiftsure 33 "IROS," plus a \$25,000 cash gift that is still making an important contributions to our Junior Sailing Program. Such gifts, along with members' volunteer labor, have helped to build our Club while keeping our charges much lower that they might otherwise have been.

When Bob Llovet, one of our Charter Members, was asked if he would make a major gift to one of these projects, he said, "Why of course I will give my yacht club; just as I would give to my family or my church." But such giving always has been totally voluntary.

Now your Board of Governors has appointed Donna Moore to lead a new campaign to replace the *badly-worn* floors in the clubhouse, a project that our budget simply cannot accommodate. Club member Bill Killebrew is in the flooring business, and has generously offered to furnish the labor free of charge if we can raise the money to buy the materials. Donna has worked hard on this and has come up with a plan. The U S Navy has a tradition of honoring some of its deserving personnel with certificates stating that they each are owners of a "plank" of the ship on which they have served their country. Such certificates become a proud possession to be exhibited long after the honoree has left the US Navy. Architect Chuck Smith, a member of the racing crew of Anne Beesley's Blue Heron, has designed a beautiful and colorful "Plank Owner's Certificate" which the Board will award to each person who donates at least \$100 to the "HIYC Club House Floor Project." Announcement of the Project was planned for the "Change of Watch" Meeting, January 14, 2007, but the word got out early and HIYC members already have committed for 39 of these "Plank Owner Certificates." Most will simply carry the name of the donor couple, but several have been given in honor of certain people or in memory of certain people. It is significant that one has been ordered in memory of Bob Llovet, who gave so much to the Club during his lifetime.


If you want one of these really good-looking, colorful "Plank Owner Certificates," simply send a separate check made out to HIYC for \$100 marked "for Plant Owner Certificate" to Fred Beesley, and attached a note telling the names you want Chuck Smith to put on it. Please don't combine your \$100 check with your dues check. Like everything Donna Moore does, the Project obviously will be a big success, and we hope to have the new floors complete by March 1st.


