Nomi Prins is a journalist and Senior Fellow at the NYC-based public policy think-tank, Demos. Her other books are: *Other People's Money: The Corporate Mugging of America* (The New Press, October 2004), chosen by The Economist, Barron's and The Library Journal as a Best Book of 2004, and *Jacked: How "Conservatives" are Picking your Pocket (whether you voted for them or not)* (Polipoint Press, Sept. 2006) Her financial thriller, *The Trail*, was published under her pseudonym, Natalia Prentice.

A frequent media commentator, Nomi has appeared on CNN, MSNBC, CNBC, CSPAN, PBS, FOX and other TV stations. She has been featured regularly on dozens of national radio shows. Her written work has appeared in The New York Times, Newsweek, The Daily Beast, Fortune, Mother Jones, Newsday, Slate.com, The Guardian UK, The Nation, The American Prospect and other publications.

Before becoming a journalist, Nomi worked on Wall Street as a managing director at Goldman Sachs, a Senior Managing Director running the international analytics group at Bear Stearns in London, and a senior derivatives strategist at Lehman Brothers. She holds a BS in Mathematics from SUNY Purchase and MS in Statistics and Operations Research from NYU, where she also completed her PhD coursework.

Nomi has spoken about corruption, finance, business ethics, economic policy and regulation to large halls and small classrooms at revered venues across the country such as Columbia University, the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, Seattle Town Hall, the Commonwealth Club in San Francisco, the Economic Policy Institute in D.C. & the Ethical Cultural Society in New York.
