From the Dean

If you want a trustworthy opinion on the subject of waiting, ask a bride. She waited for a proposal. She waits for a ring to be sized. She waits for the seamstress to finish the bridal gown. She waits for her chosen bridesmaids to indicate, one by one, their availability. She waits for guests to RSVP. She waits—it seems interminably—for the blessing of her mother-in-law.

A bride waits for the photographer to finish his work. A bride waits for the rehearsal dinner toasts to end. A bride awaits the first dance at the reception, when her groom, dressed as he may never be dressed again, takes her in his arms and glides—or was that a stumble?—across the dance floor. A bride waits to cut her cake, to toss her garter, and to bid farewell to assembled family and friends, as she and her husband make their way through rice, balloons and bubbles to tomorrow's honeymoon. Ask a bride about waiting; she knows a lot about waiting.

Some brides wait with a gracious longing. Some select hope as their guide through missteps, frustrations, missed deadlines, and unexpected disappointments. These brides believe a peace passing understanding will still the ceremonial whirlwind and point them to the assurance of a united future. They live in expectation that the marriage vow and God's blessing will redeem all that has gone before and all that is yet to come.

Other brides wait nearly consumed by a sense of anticipated loss (the loss of freedom, the loss of autonomy, the loss of control, the loss of innocence). Any talk of hope seems pointless to this bride. Bitterness follows her wherever she goes; the promise of crossing the threshold and of making a new home is easily forgotten. The pursuit of perfection in the moment becomes her supreme good, as if perfection, once achieved, might redeem an unknown future and justify the wait for its realization.

As the Bride of Christ, we wait today. We wait as his disciples for his return. "This same Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come again in the same way you saw him go into heaven." We wait for the coming Marriage Feast of the Lamb at the end of the age.

How will you walk through this season of anticipation? The Bridegroom is coming to receive his Bride. Will you wait with fear and regret and an embittering sense of impending loss? Or will you wait for him with a passionate yet gracious longing that fills the world with hope?

Godspeed Geoffrey Butcher



After months of planning and anticipation, the celebration of ministry and farewell to the Reverend Canon Geoffrey

Butcher, Canon Pastor, will come to a conclusion with the reception following the May 2, Solemn Evensong. Sometime between the Thursday night reception at the Pinnacle building downtown and Sunday afternoon, Canon Butcher will have received a copy of the Evensong canticle settings commissioned in his honor and signed by the composer, a letter box full of the letters of endearment gathered for his encouragement, and the retirement purse collected from the love of many.

Earlier Sunday morning the Bishop's deputy, the Reverend Canon Pamela Snare, will have presided over "A Service for the Ending of Pastoral Relationship and Leave-Taking from a Congregation."

Shortly before the Peace, Canon Butcher will begin a prayer from that same liturgy as follows, "*O God, you have bound us together for a time as priest and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared in these years now past.*"

That prayer will call to mind nearly two decades of ministry spanning three Christ Church administrations. We will miss Canon Butcher for the continuity of ministry that he provided this community. But we will miss him most for the passion

with which he loved Christ and his flock.

When Canon Butcher begins his retirement he will take up the pastoral care of a small congregation in the Diocese of Kentucky while continuing to live in Springfield, Tennessee. Though he will be known to many moving forward as the Vicar of Trinity Church, Russellville, Kentucky, his contact information in Springfield will remain unchanged.

Your prayers are requested for Canon Butcher as he transitions to retirement from the position of Canon Pastor at Christ Church Cathedral.

Outreach Ministry..

St. John the Divine, Johannesburg, South Africa

The missions of St. John the Divine in Johannesburg, South Africa, receive support from Christ Church Cathedral, including funds from this year's Easter offering. Under the leadership of the Rev. Gwyn Slade, one of our former sabbatical priests, the church cares for more than 800 children orphaned by AIDS in one of the city's poorest townships. The children live in households headed by grannies or by other relatives, sometimes even by the oldest brothers and sisters. They come after school each day for a nourishing meal, tutoring, counseling, and other services designed to give them a sustainable future.

At present, the house where they gather is so small that the children can come only one day a week. However, a large lot purchased for a spacious new center already provides an outdoor playground and will soon offer a place large enough to gather throughout the year. To reach that goal, St. John will open a bakery to provide steady income for the center, job training, and fresh bread for the entire community. The large sign promising this new center to the enthusiastically supportive township bears the name of Christ Church Cathedral as one of its major contributors.

Other work at St. John the Divine, whose parish dates back to the days of British rule, includes advocacy for families living on a nearby dump, micro-enterprises for unemployed women, and the Angel Garden, where infants left dead on the city streets receive a name and Christian burial.
