The Grand Ole Opry is a long way from the farm lands of Alabama, but through hard work, honest effort, and great talent and years of writing hit songs for other greats, Marty Robbins, Conway Twitty, Tammy Wynette, and Jeanne Pruett, the lady made it. She was named in 1973, the 63rd member of the most prestigious radio show in the entire world, The Grand Ole Opry. The following year was none the less eventful. After three years of playing to packed houses all over Europe, Jeanne was named Female Vocalist of the Year in London, England. Jeanne was nominated by the Country Music Association the same year for Female Artist, Song of the Year, Record of the Year, and Album of the Year, all for her wonderful song "Satin Sheets". Billboard Magazine also honored her with awards for Female Album as well as Best Album of the year 1974.

1985 has been an exciting time for Jeanne. What better place than her annual Fish Fry and Show during Fan Fair to sign a new record deal. With most of the membership of her fan club present, Jeanne signed with MCA/DOT Records. Her first album with the new label is wonderful and she's looking forward to a second album in the late summer of '86. Most recently is Jeanne Pruett's Feedin' Friends Cookbook, Volumn I. A longtime promise to herself to write this book, now has been realized.

Her work for Retarded Children of the World has never ceased. The Shrine Burn Hospital of America has honored her countless times for her efforts on their behalf. Jeanne tries to, as she says, "Put something back into the business for all the great things it's given to me."
