TWO ATTORNEYS JOIN LEGAL AID SOCIETY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Sept. 29, 2009 – The Legal Aid Society announced today that two lawyers have joined the board of directors for the state’s largest non-profit law firm. Robert L. Sullivan, partner with Nashville law firm Loeb & Loeb LLP and Cumberland County Bar Association President Caroline E. Knight, a private attorney with a practice in Crossville.
