Foreword

The Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association (TICUA) is pleased to present *Characteristics Spring 2008*. This seventh edition of the report highlights trends in student participation, affordability, and degree completion for our member institutions and their students through the fall semester 2007.

Our 37 member colleges and universities educate more than 66,500 students from across the state, throughout the country, and around the world. TICUA member institutions enrolled 24% of the students in Tennessee, but awarded 34% of all degrees in the state.

The document has three distinct sections. Section One provides a one-year snapshot of the private educational sector in Tennessee as a whole. Section Two presents trends over time at the independent colleges and universities. Section Three offers comparisons of the private educational sector to public education in Tennessee. Two appendices extend a detailed picture of each of the member campuses.

We hope that *Characteristics Spring 2008* is informative to you. Together these sections are intended to inform campus, business, and government leaders who provide direction for higher education policy at the institution, local, state, and federal levels. We strive to ensure that the information contained in this publication is as accurate and current as possible.

The data contained in this report were furnished by member institutions as part of TICUA's enrollment and completions reporting cycle. Additional data sources, if any, are indicated by notes accompanying each figure. We wish to thank our member institutions for working with us over the years to accurately and timely reflect the contributions of Tennessee independent colleges and universities.

2007 TICUA Highlights

Participation:

Enrollment by Headcount

- TICUA member institutions enrolled about one-quarter (24%) of the students attending college in Tennessee.
- From fall 2006 to fall 2007, enrollment at TICUA member campuses increased over 3% to an all-time record high (from 64,556 to 66,611) .
- Females comprised nearly 60% of the total enrollment at TICUA member colleges and universities.
- Minority students composed nearly one-quarter (23%) of the undergraduate students attending TICUA member colleges and universities.
- 56% of students attending TICUA member institutions were Tennessee residents, while 44% were from other states and countries.
- TICUA member colleges enrolled students from every county in the State.

Enrollment by Full-time Equivalency (FTE)

- Fall 2007 FTE enrollment was 61,883 – up nearly 4% from the previous year and an all-time high for TICUA member campuses.

Affordability:

Grant Aid

- Institutional aid accounted for more than two-thirds (69%) of all grant aid given to students attending private colleges and universities, followed by 18% from the State, and 13% from the federal government.

Tennessee Educational Lottery Scholarship Award (TELS)

- In 2007-08, more than 9,456 students attending TICUA institutions received the TELS award.

Tennessee Student Assistance Award (TSAA)

- In 2007-08, more than 3,852 students attending TICUA member campuses received the TSAA. The per-student average yearly award amount was \$4,312.

Federal Pell Grant

- In 2007-08, more than one-quarter of all undergraduate students (13,477) attending TICUA member campuses received the Federal Pell Grant award. The per-student average yearly award amount totaled over \$3,237.

Tuition and Fees

- In 2007-08, tuition and fees at TICUA four-year member colleges and universities averaged 28% less than the national average (\$16,932 compared to \$23,712).

Completion:

- Tennessee's independent colleges had higher graduation rates for their students compared to the state's public universities.
- TICUA member campuses awarded more master's, doctoral, and professional degrees than any other higher education sector in the state.
- In 2006-07, our colleges and universities graduated more than 3,000 business and management leaders, 3,000 educators, and 1,800 health care professionals.

Figure 1: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Attendance Status - Undergraduate

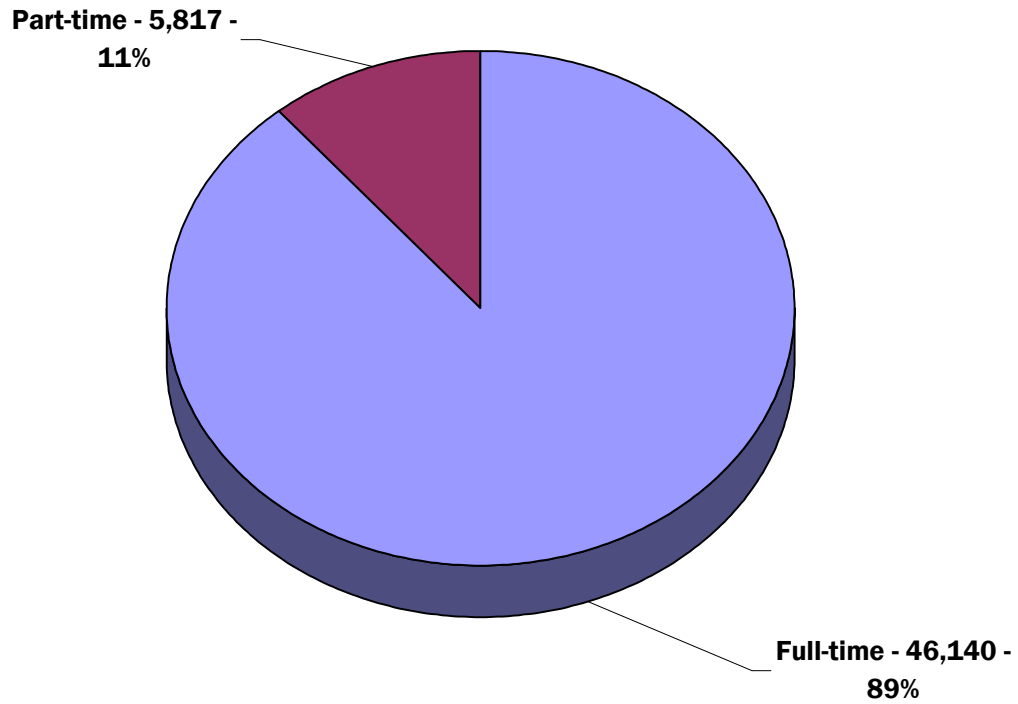


Figure 2: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Attendance Status - Graduate and First-Professional

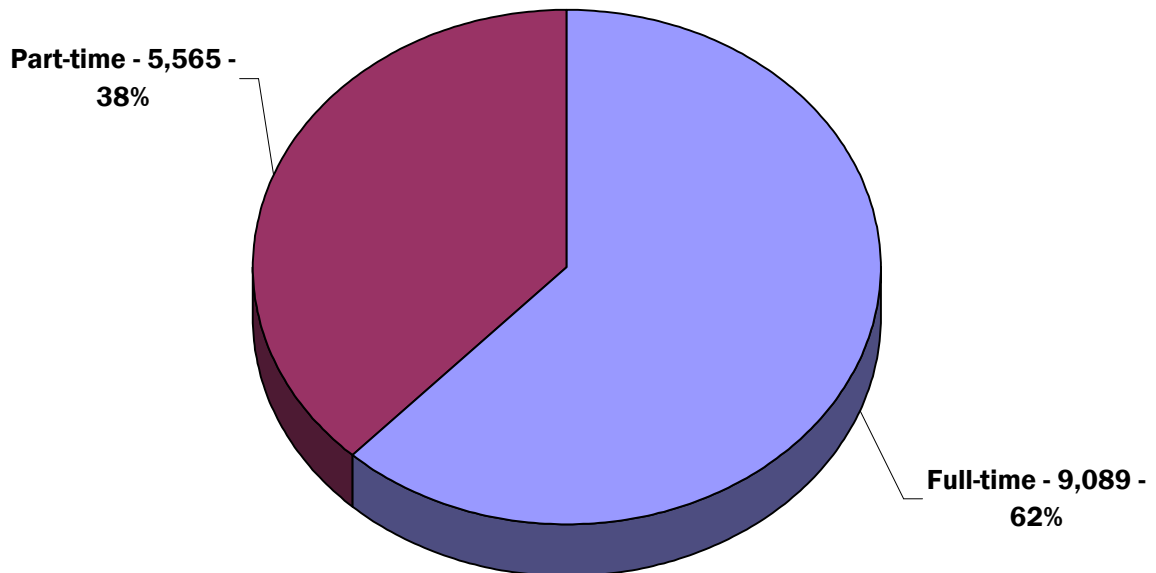


Figure 3: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Gender - Undergraduate

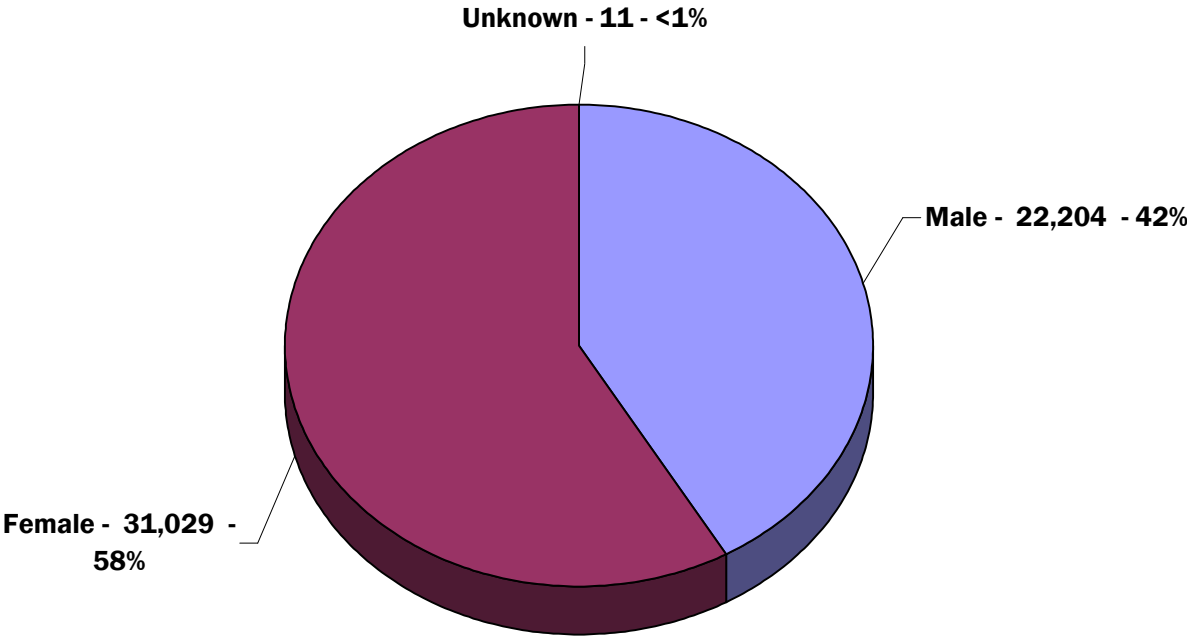
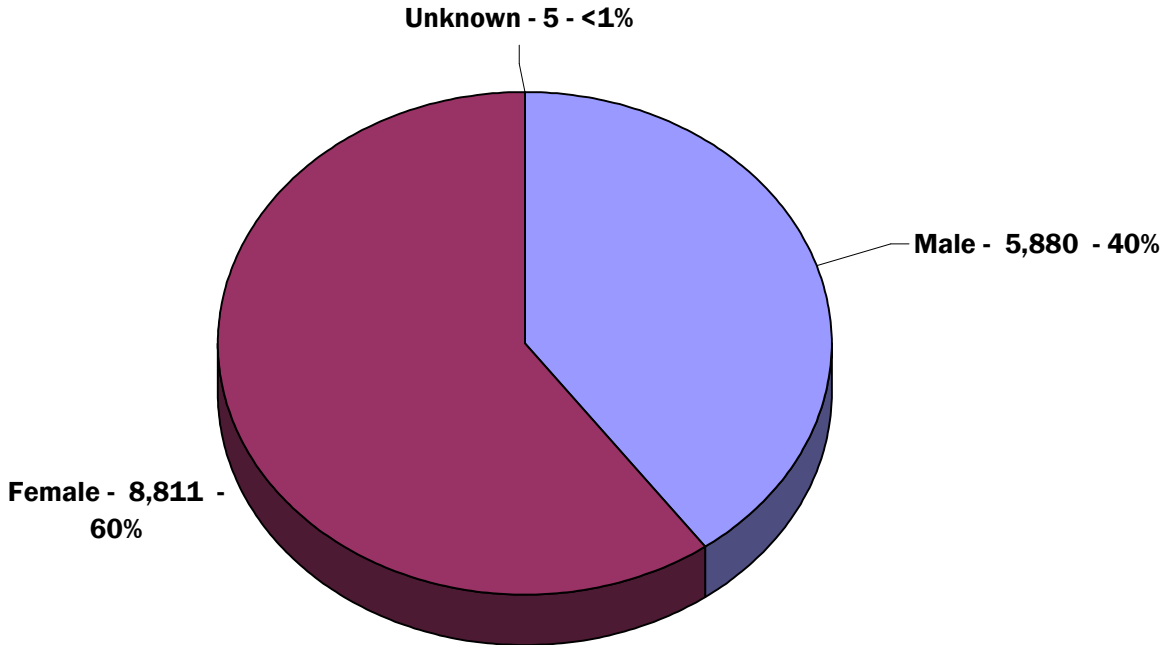


Figure 4: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Gender - Graduate and First-Professional

Figure 5: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Ethnicity - Undergraduate

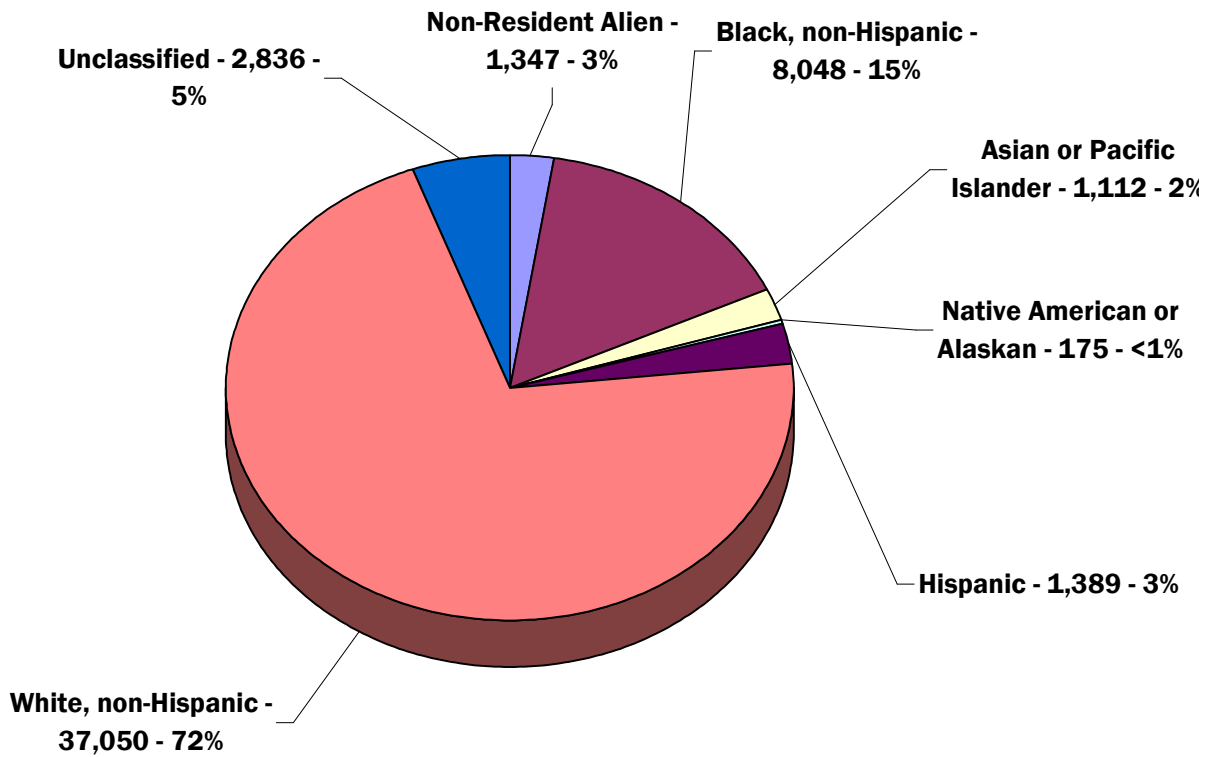
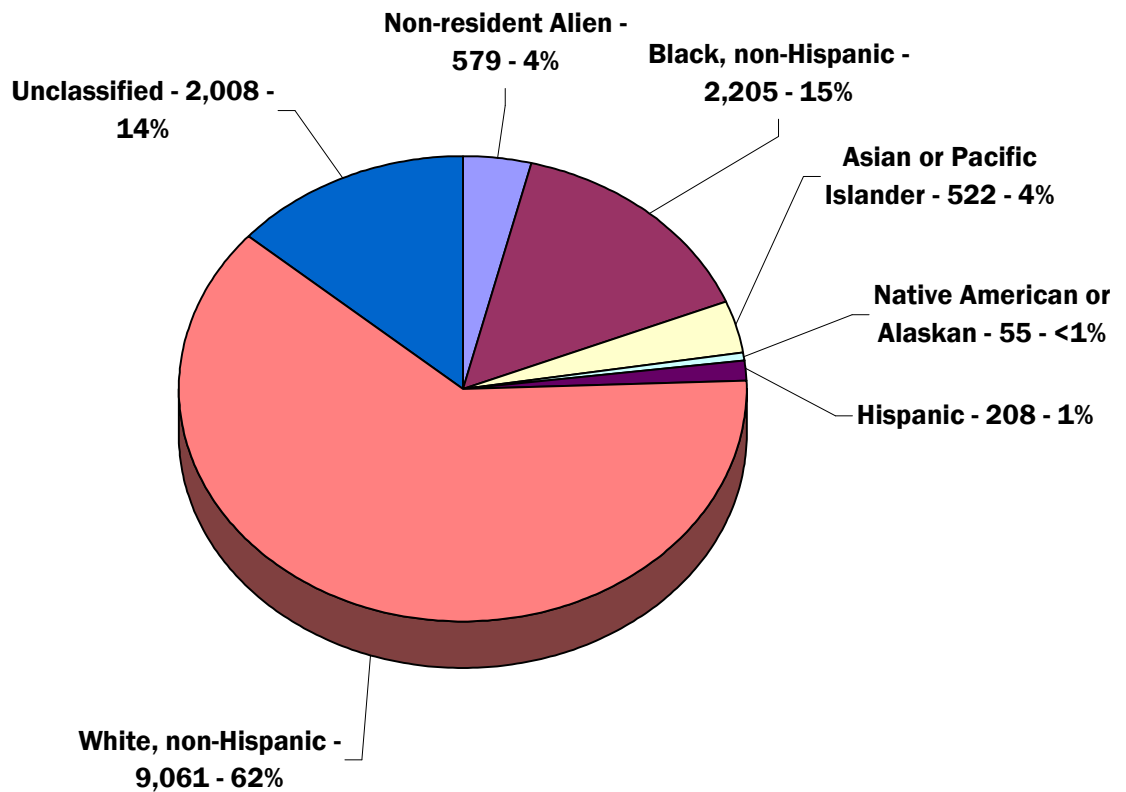
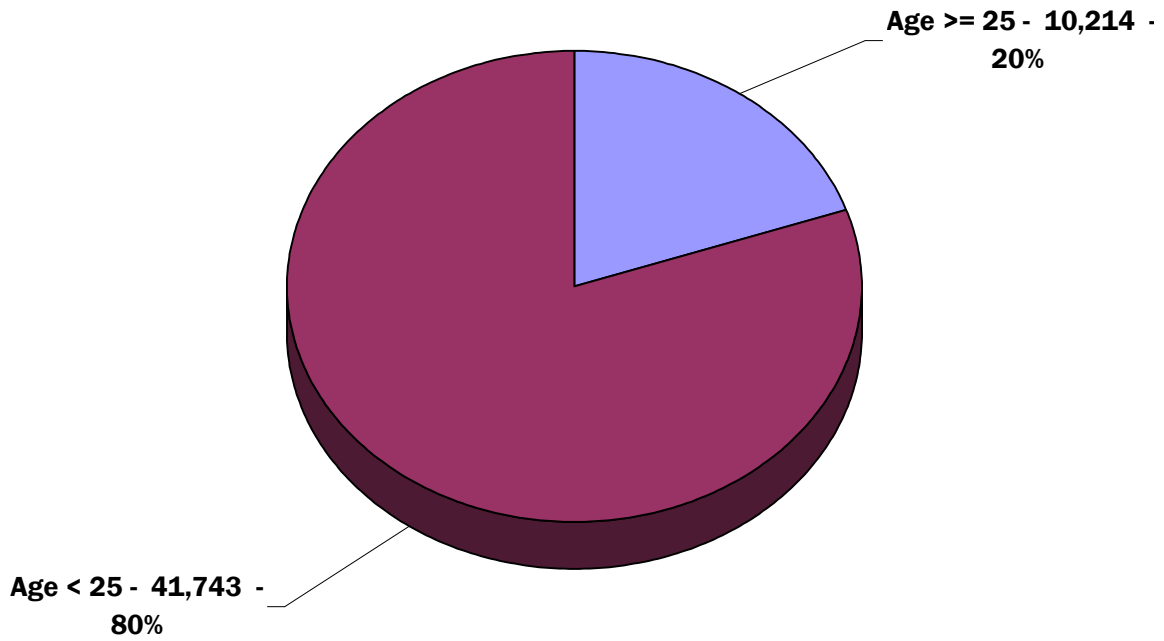


Figure 6: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Headcount, by Ethnicity - Graduate and First-Professional

In-State vs. Out-of-State - All Students**

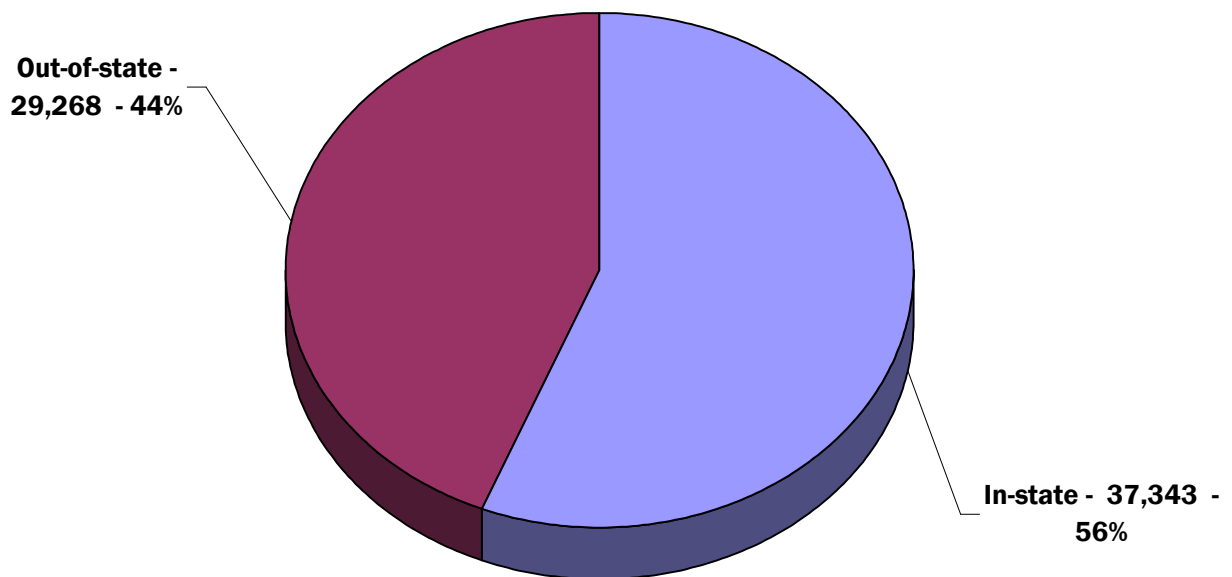
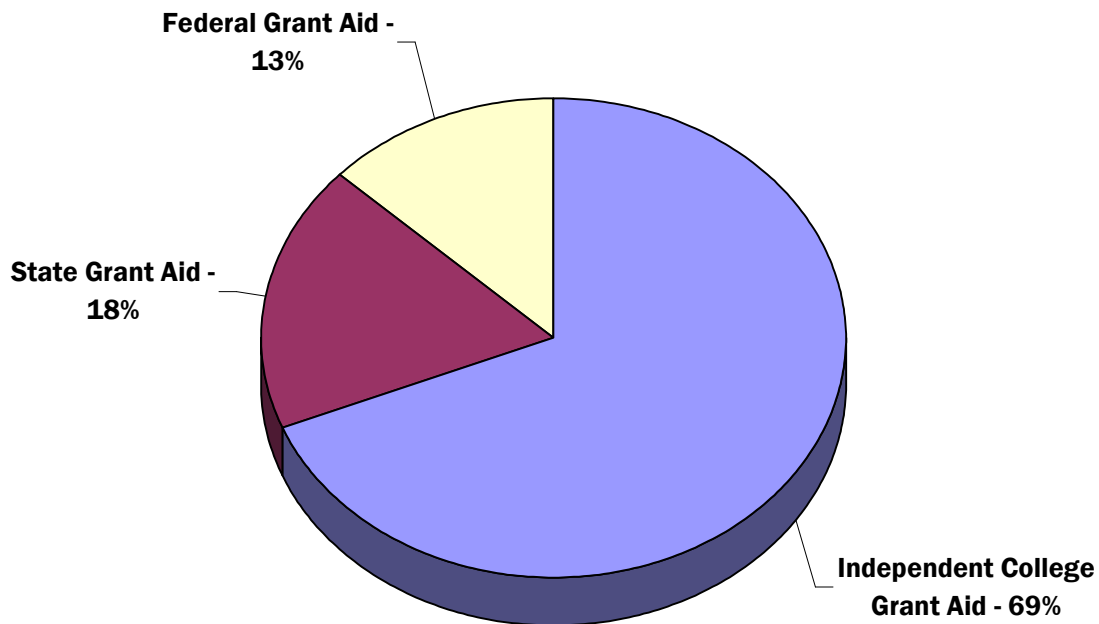


Figure 9: Sources of Grant Aid - Fall 2005

Figure 13: Distribution of TICUA Membership by Undergraduate Tuition and Fees (4-Year Institutions)

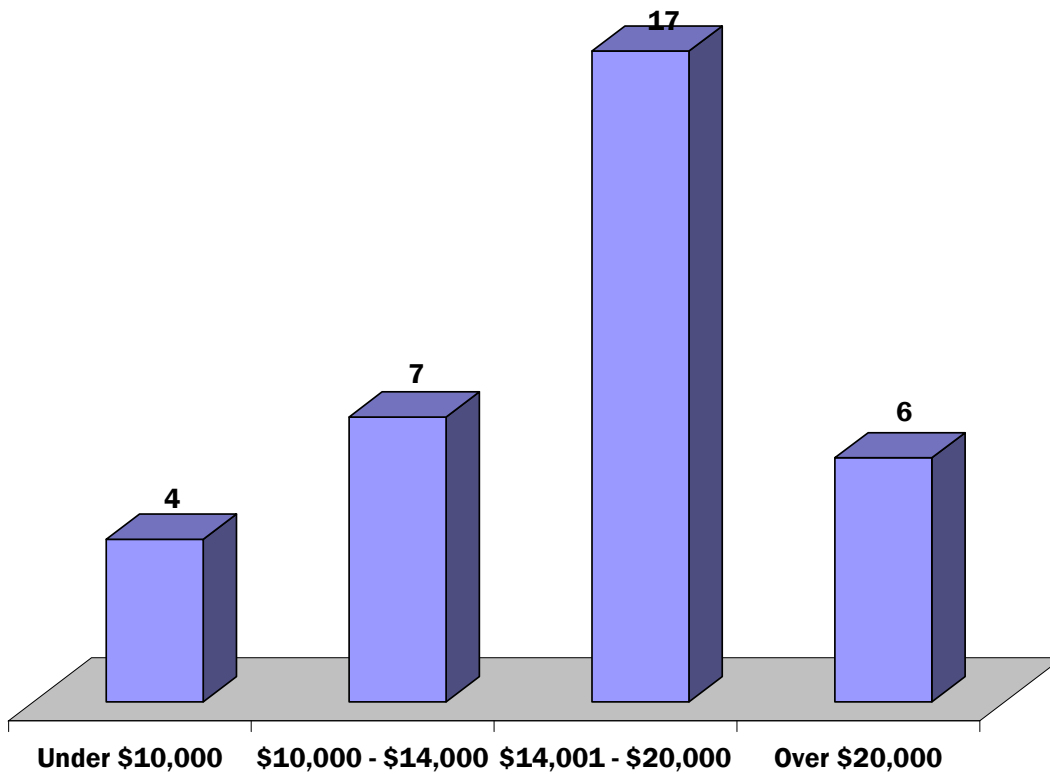



Figure 14: Tuition and Fee Charges—2007- 08



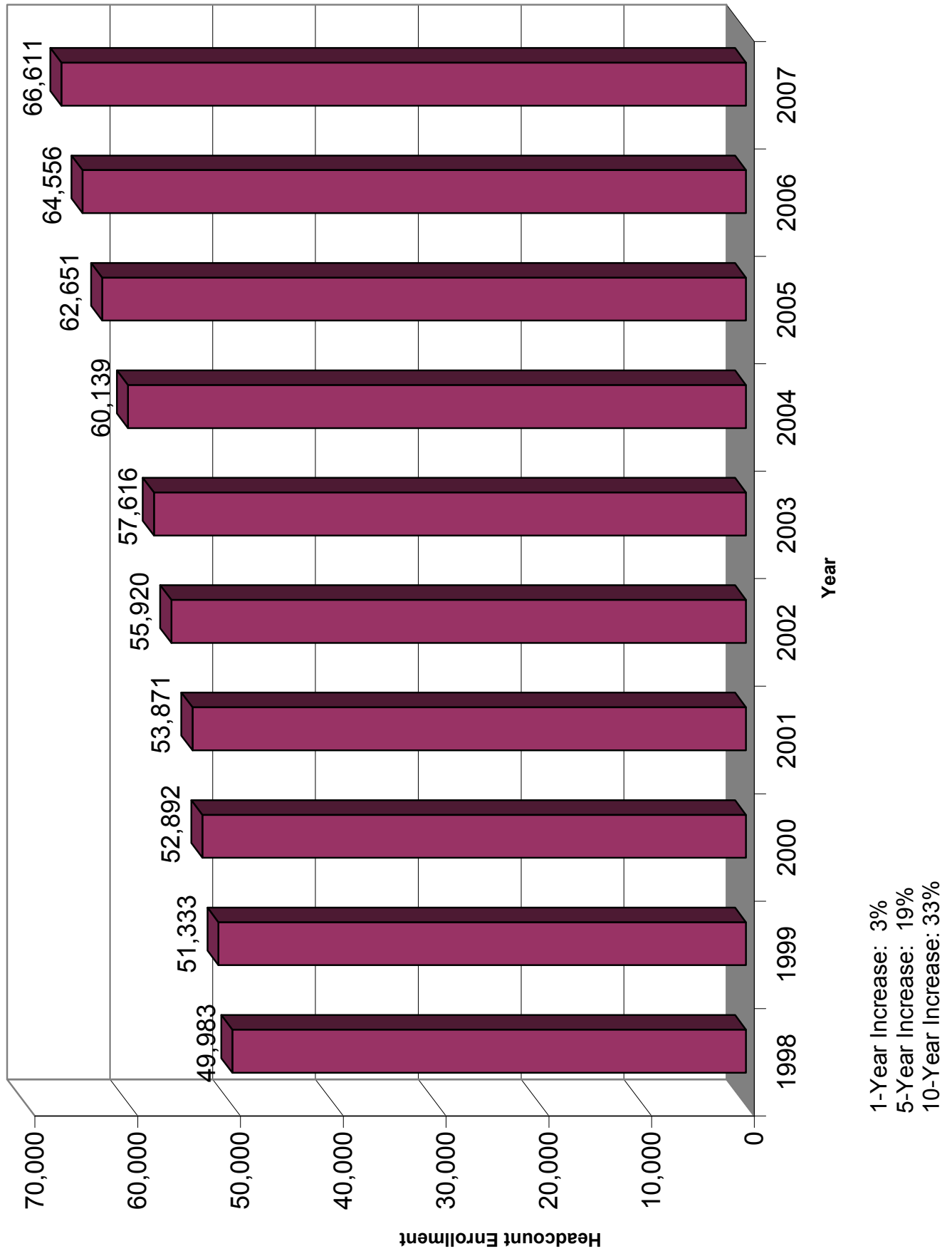

10-Year Trend (1998 - 2007)**

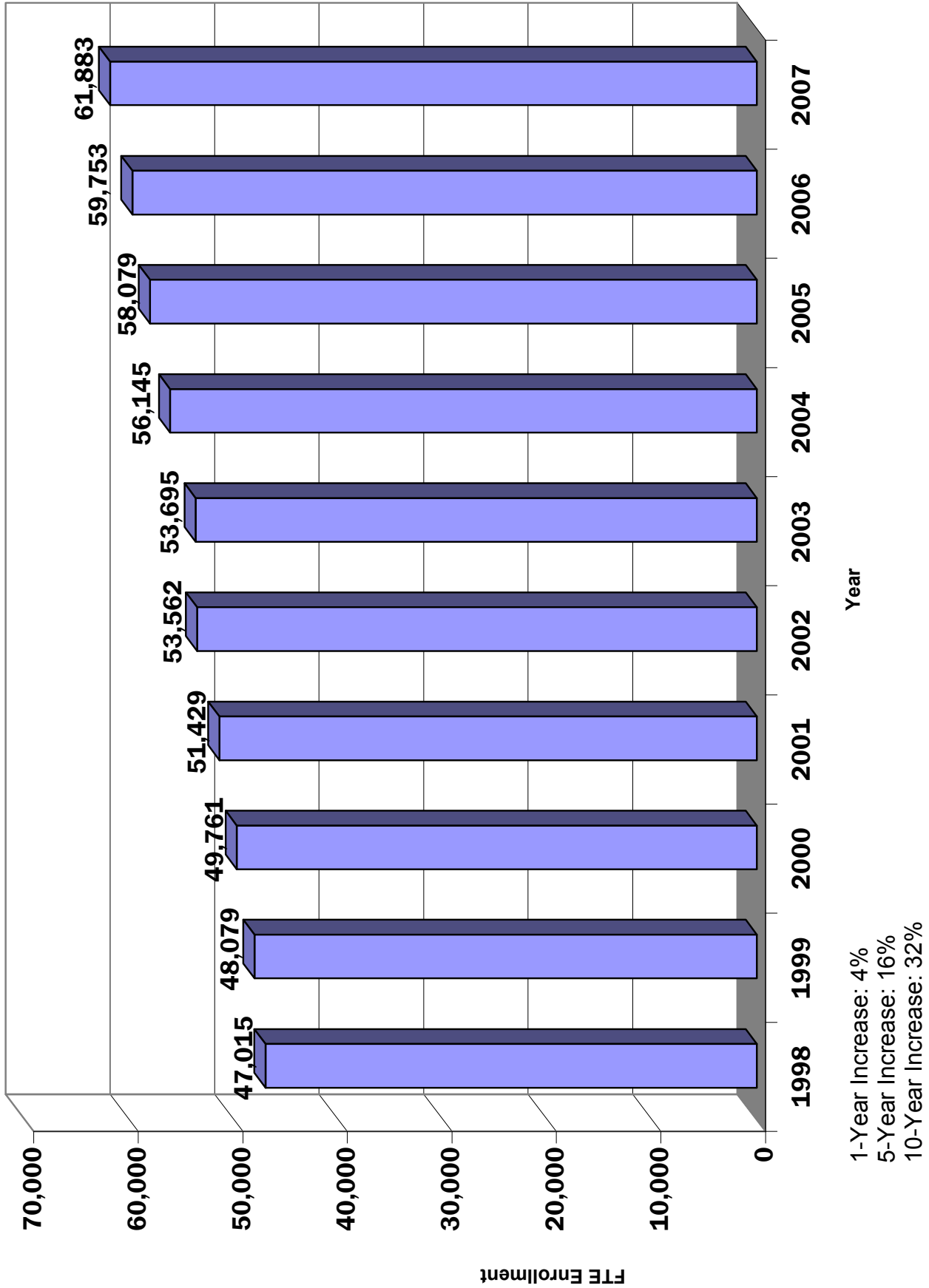

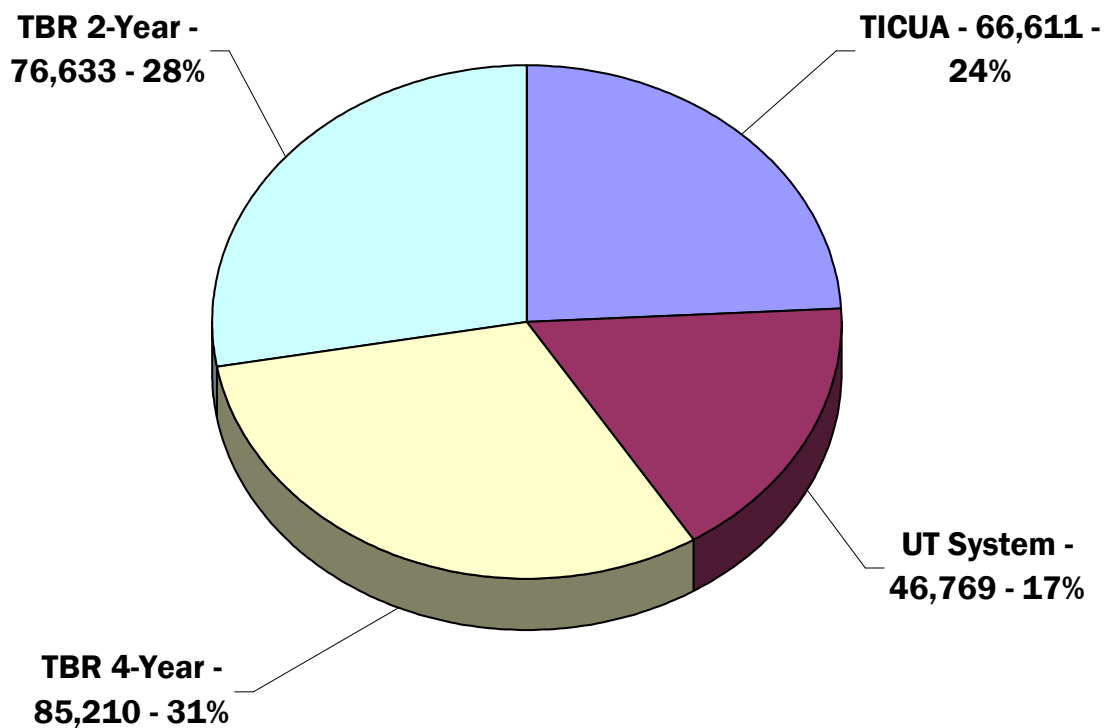
Figure 17: Fall 2007 Enrollment by Higher Education Sector

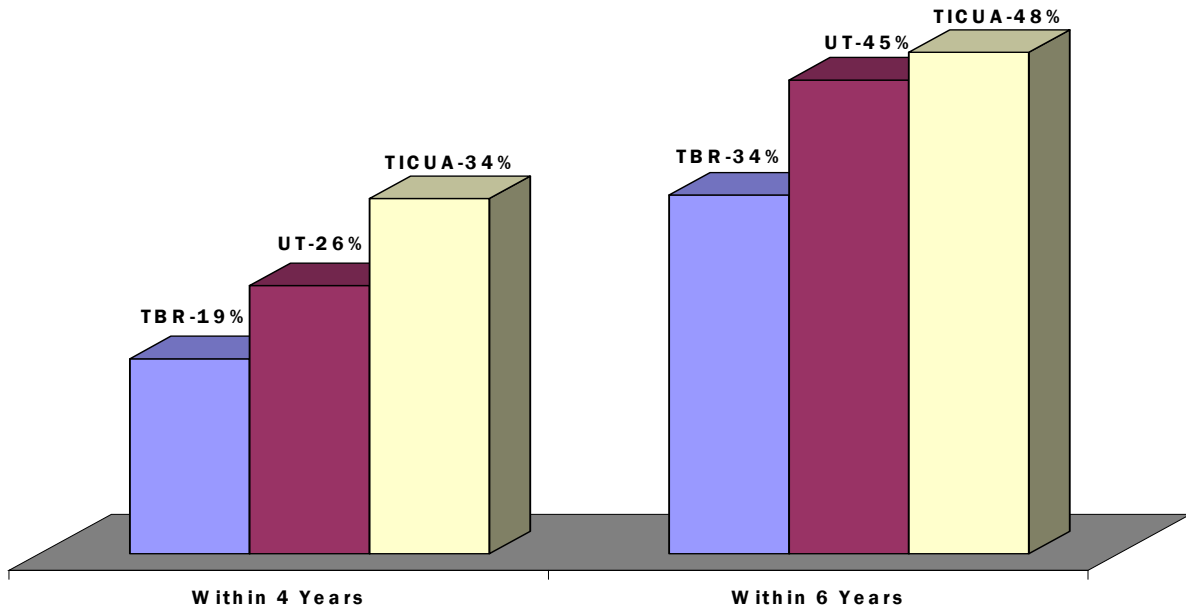

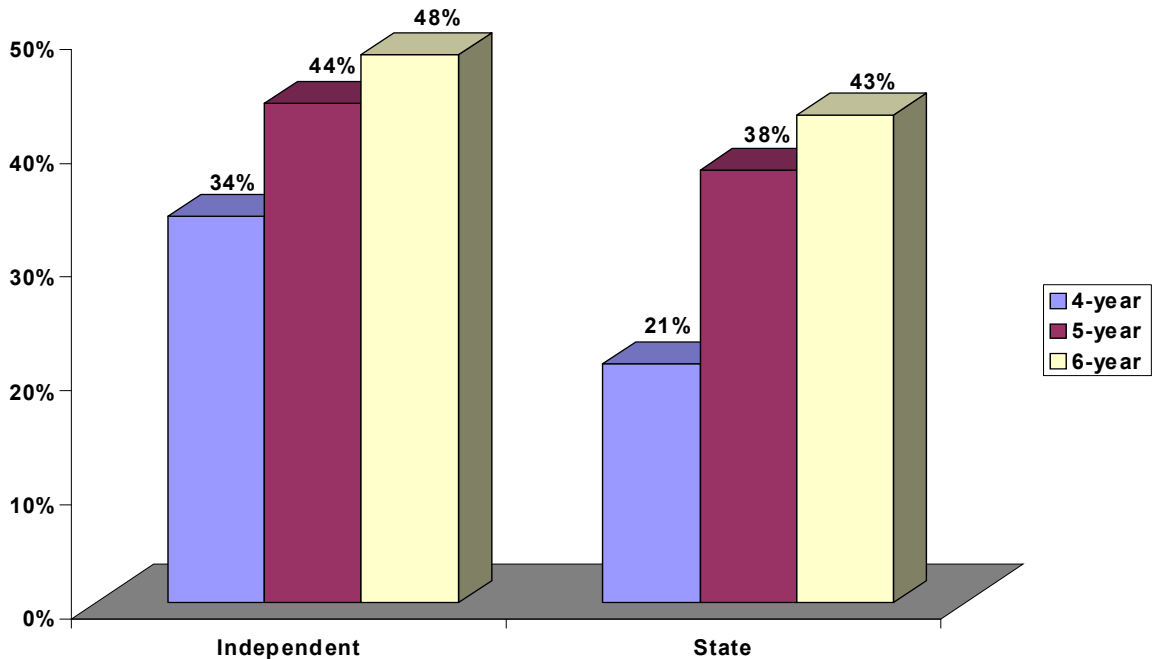
Figure 19: Four and Six-Year Graduation Rates By Higher Education Sector - 2001 Cohort

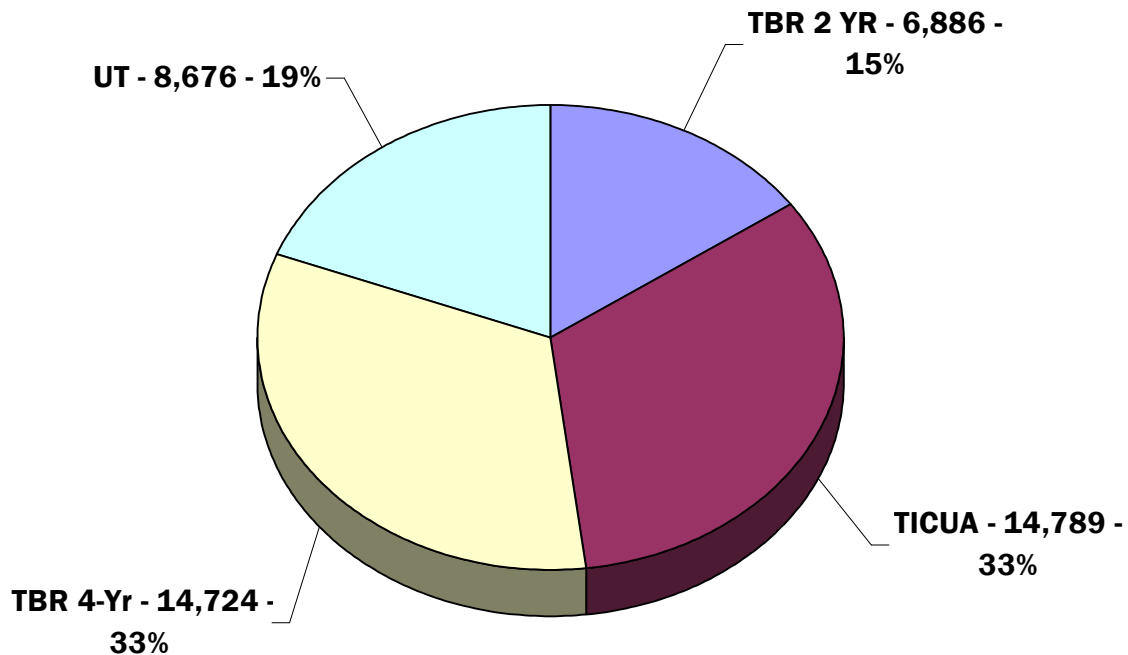
