# PENCIL VOLUNTEERS SHINE AT STROBEL AWARDS

PENCIL is proud to announce that some special volunteers took top honors at the 2008 Mary Catherine Strobel Awards.



### WINNER, YOUTH VOLUNTEER

#### Bailey Roberts, president of Pencil Projects

*Pencil Projects is an organization under the umbrella of Vanderbilt's Office of Active Citizenship & Service.*

This year, under Roberts' leadership, the organization went from 32 members in Spring 2007 to a 120-member organization in Fall 2007. Bailey worked with PENCIL's Ann Johnston, director of Reading Partners, to recruit and place volunteers to work with children. These volunteers are impacting the lives of 165 children who need extra assistance in reading in order to be successful in school.

That's an estimated 480-540 hours of combined volunteer time from these volunteers. In addition, the Pencil Projects student board generated 250 hours of volunteer time, organizing volunteers, training and arranging carpools.

### FINALIST, VOLUNTEER INNOVATOR

#### McGavock High School Lifeskills Class

After shopping at LP PENCIL Box, MacDawson Burton, Life Skills teacher at McGavock High School, saw an opportunity for his students.

Since September, volunteering at LP PENCIL Box has become part of these students' curriculum every Monday through Wednesday from 9:30-11 a.m. Around 10-15 students each day restock the shelves, unload and inventory supply donations, help clean up the store, break down boxes for recycling and bundle and organize donations. This is 75 hours of volunteer time each week that helps fill a critical need for the program and provides students the hands-on experience they need to develop essential skills needed to be successful in the workplace. 📦

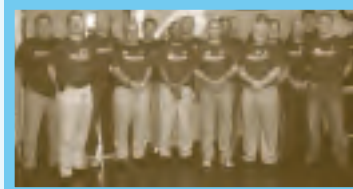

# HOME BUYER EDUCATION TRAINING: BUILDING WEALTH ONE STEP AT A TIME



Shonta Sweatt is proud to be a homeowner. After enrolling in PENCIL's Homebuyer Education Program in 2007 she purchased a new condominium this past January. "I couldn't be happier about owning a piece of the American dream," she said. "I could not have done it without PENCIL's help."

The Homebuyer Education Program is an added component of PENCIL's Job Skills Training & Employment Program, where participants gain the financial education, training and job placement assistance needed to achieve economic stability. This is a voluntary program with a minimum of eight hours of in-depth education counseling and training. It is designed to prepare consumers emotionally and financially for the commitment and investment of buying a home and avoid the pitfalls of home-ownership. Topics include assessing readiness, managing money, understanding credit, financing, selecting and maintaining a home. Program participants receive a certificate of completion and are offered access to mortgage/ down payment assistance programs available through various government and housing agencies.

According to the 2002 Fannie Mae National Housing Survey, more people could become homeowners if armed with the correct information.

"Our clients all share the same dream of owning a home. For most, it is within their reach." said Jacque Green, Director of JSTEP. "Research shows us that when participants are motivated to find a job, buy a house, or save towards particular goal, they may be much more open to acquiring the financial skills necessary to reach their objective when faced with an immediate incentive."

Reaching prospective homebuyers like Shonta is a goal only limited by funding. If you are interested in helping JSTEP give people the tools to become knowledgeable and successful first-time homebuyers, call Jacque Green at 242-3167 x 259. 🏡

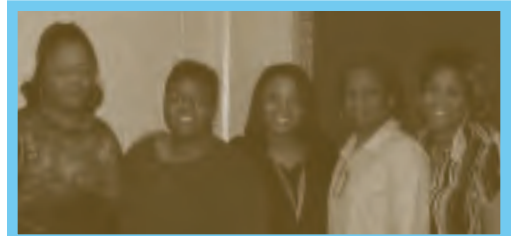

# LEARNING WORK SKILLS AT LP PENCIL BOX

Two 9th students at Nashville Big Picture High School have been hard at work at LP PENCIL Box (LPPB) since February. As part of the school's curriculum, students participate in internships to obtain the work skills they'll need after graduation. Michael Walker and Kevin Burke have been a huge asset to Sarah Killpack, program manager for LPPB.

"Having the interns' help at the store has made a world of difference this year," said Killpack. "We have several pallets of supplies arriving each week and around 100 teachers a week emptying the shelves so having extra hands to unload, sort and restock has been invaluable."

The interns work at LPPB from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday and go to class the rest of the week. Killpack works closely with their teachers at Big Picture to make sure their education goals are being met. The interns see how their classes apply to everyday life while learning job skills. They inventory donations, work with groups of volunteers to restock the store, and assist with teacher shopping. Michael and Kevin, even though they work very hard, both enjoy their time at LPPB. 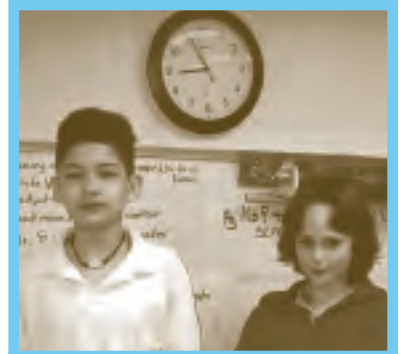

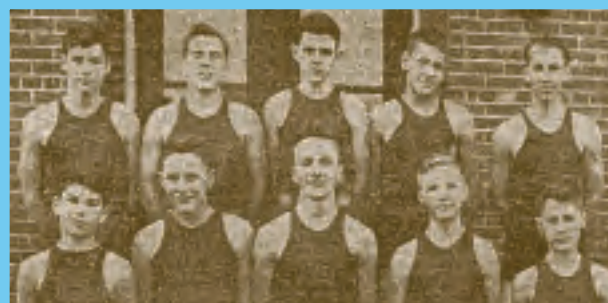
