children in that village, we immediately saw pure happiness and appreciation in their faces. Often I ignore all of the simple yet significant gestures in everyday life. This trip is extremely hard to explain in just a few words, but those that come to mind are incredible, fun, hopeful, magnificent, but most importantly rewarding! --Kelsey Urness

Our trip to Bolivia has given me a completely new perspective. Visiting the Amistad culture and venturing outside of my usual bubble was an incredible learning experience. We hear that our American culture always wants more and until this trip, that had no deep meaning to me. Now, after spending a week at Amistad, I am aware that we do have so much, but some of us are *still* not happy. The majority of the children at the Villa have grown up in terrible circumstances and yet they are able to see the good in people and the bright side of everything. The joy in these children's faces when we all sat down and played a card game or kicked the soccer ball around is indescribable. --Bailey Quiggle

I went into this trip not exactly knowing what to expect or how it could change me. I had heard many stories and seen many pictures. I sit in church each week praying for the kids at Kantuta House...Marybel, Neysa, Noemina, Wilson, etc: and it was amazing to finally meet them and see how genuinely happy they are. They are full of tremendous love and welcome everyone by running up, grabbing your hands, and never letting go. The children at the Villa may lack material items, but instead they possess so much more inside, which is shown every day in their thoughts and actions. It made me very aware of how materialistic I have become and my need to change.

The Amistad children's relationship with God is extremely powerful and kept alive with the strong Christian Education program at the Villa and by their daily prayers and reflections. When we traveled to Aramasi and handed out lollipops to

One of the most powerful memories I will always have is of the sunrise hike we took while in Aramasi (altitude of 10,000 ft). This was the most remote place I have ever been in my life. As we awoke in the freezing cold temperature to start our hike, the valley was completely silent. The sun rose in one magnificent pure yellow color without any air pollution to change its appearance. I watched the golden sunlight spread over the mountains behind me as I sat fending off Otto, the local dog that followed us everywhere. Being involved with organizations like the Amistad Mission is an amazing opportunity for youth or anyone and it can truly change your life. --Devin Urness

The trip overall and its impact on me is also indescribable. Amistad is simply something you have to experience. I was not prepared for how much the children there would change my life. I want to be closely involved with Amistad and Bolivia for the rest of my life. --Hannah Claybrook

20 Years of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program at Christ Church Cathedral



We are just beginning the 20th year of the catechesis program at Christ Church Cathedral. This program was introduced to the Cathedral through the efforts of the Reverend Canon Anne Stevenson who was familiar with it in her former parish in Jackson, Mississippi.

This Biblically-based program of children's religious formation was first used in Rome in 1954 and since that time has spread world-wide.

It blends religious formation with Montessori principles recognizing that even very young children have their own spiritual lives. In the catechesis program children have the freedom, space, time, language and stories essential for their spiritual growth.

Adult leaders are trained in both the religious lessons and the developmental needs of the children. This program involves adult formation side by side with the children's formation.

So we take this time to celebrate the vitality of this program, to reflect on the vision and energy of the many adults responsible for its growth and to honor the spiritual life of the children in our community.

The Cathedral offices will be closed July 3, and July 4, in observance of the Fourth of July holiday.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Learning Opportunity

Are you looking for a way to further your own faith, to learn more about the Bible and the liturgy and to engage in an adult learning experience? We will be offering Catechesis of the Good Shepherd training beginning in September. St. Luke's Day Mission, Nashville:

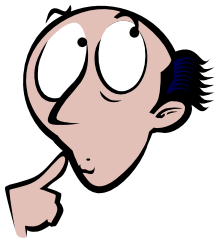

The Reverend Thomas Morris, the new Executive Director of St. Mary's Sewanee, a Center for Spiritual Growth, will be the keynote speaker for the Third Annual Gathering of Contemplative Outreach of Middle Tennessee on Saturday, August 15, at Christ Church Cathedral. His topic will be "*Living From the Inside Out: The Contemplative Path and Freedom.*"

The event is open to all persons seeking to direct their attention toward God -- those already involved with Contemplative Outreach and those who are interested in learning more about contemplative living and contemplative prayer. Those new to contemplation may attend an Introduction to Centering Prayer workshop, while others will hear presentations and participate in discussions concerning the practice of contemplative living.

A New Harmony: The Spirit, The Earth, and The Human Soul

John Philip Newell



John Philip Newell is a poet, a scholar and a teacher. Formerly Warden of Iona Abbey in the Western Isles of Scotland, he is currently Companion Theologian for the American Spirituality Centre of Casa del Sol in the high desert of New Mexico. He is internationally acclaimed for his work in the field of Celtic spirituality, including his best known titles *Listening for the Heartbeat of God* and *Christ of*

the Celts, as well as his poetic book of prayer *Sounds of the Eternal*. He is a Church of Scotland minister with a passion for peace in the world and a fresh vision for harmony between the great spiritual traditions of humanity. Canadian by birth, he lives in Edinburgh with his family where he undertook his doctoral research in Celtic Christianity. Since then he has played a leading role on both sides of the Atlantic in the re-birthing of a creation spirituality for today.

Newell describes this program as follows: "Like never before in the history of humanity we are becoming aware of the essential unity of life, and that what we do to a part we do to the whole. Wellness is found not in separation but in relationship, whether as nations and wisdom traditions or as individuals and as a whole earth community. How can our spirituality today be part of serving this new consciousness?"

THE LIVING WELL MINISTRY Bringing Mothers and Children Back Together

Imagine being a single mother all alone... no father in your children's lives--no grandparents to help--no church--no kindly neighbors or close friends. You have never had anyone show you how to be a proper parent and through circumstances, your children are taken away to live in a foster home. Who would help you get your children back? What would you do?

Annie Hamilton, founder of The Living Well Ministry, served as a foster mother for nearly 20 years. During that time, she encountered birth parents who didn't understand their role in their children's education. No one sat down to help them complete their homework, so they didn't think to do the same for their children. She also met parents who never learned how to budget their finances and spend on necessities first. In addition, Annie recognized that many birth parents felt guilty after their children were removed, and this lack of self-esteem made it harder for them to move forward.

When Annie retired as a foster parent, she wanted to create an organization that would target the problems that land some children in foster care. She believes that some families are willing and able to reunite, if given extra support and guidance. So, she formed The Living Well Ministry, a 501C3 organization, which recruits volunteers to teach birth parents better parenting skills. These include better time and money management, better decision making practices and problem solving. Volunteers meet parents in a suitable place such as their home, court or church to begin the process of getting their children back. Volunteers are fully trained and a support system is in place to help if needed. Some Living Well volunteers work indirectly with fund-raising, book-keeping, and telephone follow-up to persons who have been referred by Hands-On-Nashville as potential mentors. Other volunteers commit to pray for a specific family. There is a role for everyone to play to make this ministry work.
