Applications Now Available for Professional Development Grants for Artists

[Raleigh, N.C.] – Local artists interested in applying for up to \$1,500 in grant money are invited to apply for a Professional Development Grant for Artists, sponsored by United Arts Council of Raleigh and Wake County. This project is supported by the North Carolina Arts Council, a division of the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources. Professional development grants are offered to artists in Warren, Franklin, Johnston, Vance and Wake counties, age 18 or older, and not enrolled in a degree program.

Grants provides financial support to committed, gifted individual artists and small, unincorporated groups of collaborating artists. The grant is designed to support projects that will advance the applicant’s career in demonstrable ways. The grant is open to emerging and established artists in dance, drama, film/media, literary/playwright, music and visual art.

Previous grantees have received funds for the following projects:

- for a photographer to buy a new camera lens,
- for a writer to pay for copyediting,
- for the production of a dance performance,
- to attend workshops and residencies,
- to travel overseas to study with a specific teacher, and
- studio time to make a musical recording.

“We truly want artists to feel encouraged to apply,” says Brandi Neuwirth, community art coordinator at United Arts. “We are able to support artists through the application process and provide feedback at any step.”

A workshop will be held Sunday, March 4 at 2 pm at United Arts' office (410 Glenwood Ave. Raleigh). It is designed to demystify the application process for these grants. There is also a webinar available online.

All application materials must be submitted online by Monday, April 2, 2018. No paper copies are required.
